PHASE ONE IMPROVEMENTS BEGIN JULY 2011

The Rodeo Valley Trail Rehabilitation and Improvement Project will restore riparian habitat, reduce trail flooding during the winter, and create an improved pedestrian, bicyclist and equestrian trail corridor for travel between Capehart and Rodeo Lagoon. The new trail will be a safer, more scenic alternative to Bunker Road. Phase One will be completed in 2011 and Phase Two will be completed in 2012.

The western section of the Rodeo Valley Trail will be closed in October.

PHASE ONE PROJECT ACTIONS

- Install two new bridges and connector trails at west Capehart and east Smith Road.
- Realign trail away from wetland habitat and restore adjacent wetland and riparian area.



2011 SCHEDULE

JULY

- Project staging areas set up adjacent to Capehart Housing and the lower Historic Rifle Range. Parking in these areas will be limited and construction equipment will be entering and exiting from Bunker Road.

AUGUST

- Install new Capehart and Smith Road bridges. Construction equipment will access bridge sites via the Rodeo Valley Trail.
- Stockpile chert (a native rock) from other Project Headlands actions for Phase One and Phase Two trail installation.

SEPTEMBER

- Install connecting trails and boardwalks at both bridge sites.

OCTOBER

- Complete new trail alignment and restore wetland on the western end of the Rodeo Valley Trail. This area will be closed once trail work begins and will reopen in November, 2011.
